Access to Capital

Capital serves as the lifeblood for small businesses that enable them to handle basic operations, cover daily expenses, and facilitate expansion.

Small businesses in the District have a variety of options for securing capital. Choosing the right lender depends on factors such as a business's financial health, the purpose of the loan, and repayment terms that align with the business's cash flow.

Community Development Financial Institutions

Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs) are specialized financial institutions that provide affordable financial services, such as loans and investments, to underserved communities and small businesses.
